I officially met Amani Ayers at the Miami Beach City Hall for the proclamation of 6/22/22 as the Miami Beach Community Emergency Response Team Day, but that was not the first time we had seen each other. She attends various cultural and city events/functions, serves on various boards, and volunteers her time to make the Miami Beach and South Florida communities better places to live, work and play.

Amani has been a Miami Beach resident for nearly forty (40) years and an active CERT member for the past fifteen (15) years. Originally from Baltimore, Maryland and a Bachelor of Arts graduate from Colgate University, Amani first visited Miami Beach during Spring break in the 70s and immediately fell in love with the sun, the sand, the sea and the feeling of being in a "Tropical paradise". Ten years later, she made her dream a reality when she relocated to a 1bdrm apartment on Ocean Drive overlooking the palms and the ocean. Amani partnered with an owner of a local Juice Bar and together they established Miami Beach's 1st VEGAN RESTAURANT - OUR PLACE NATURAL FOODS on Washington Ave (1983 - 1994). Nowadays, Amani is a Realtor Associate at Platinum Properties International and markets herself as "The Go To Realtor." She is also a "culturalist", she loves all music genres, the theater, symphony, and the visual and performance arts and an avid traveler, that enjoys cruises.

Amani Ayers first heard about CERT when she attended the Miami Beach Neighborhood Leadership Academy and thought that being able to get education and hands on experience to be a first responder from a neighborhood perspective would be invaluable, especially that she was living in a condo where she was already active with emergency evacuation etc. and she is always willing to help.

As a condo resident and once a member of the board, Amani has been on scene for many emergencies throughout the years, and thanks to her CERT training she feels she has been able to respond to incidents and provide leadership and guidance. She is thankful that there have not been any major disasters in Miami Beach, though she experienced a rapid flooding where water on the streets had reached to 'breast level'. She felt that the training helped her to maintain composure, take leadership and be methodical and systematic on what to do and provide assistance to her neighbors.

We also asked Amani some questions that may be on your mind as well:

Why should one get CERT trained and certified?

For the benefit of their own safety, and the safety of their family, neighbors and to help others. CERT help makes sure that the citizens are empowered with the knowledge and mindset to handle certain emergencies until Fire rescue & Police get there and not let panic and fear take over during those situations.

It is also important for residents to be involved and be able to make a difference.

What would you say to people that are curious about CERT but unsure whether to put in the time?

The knowledge you gain through the CERT program is invaluable for anyone! The training, techniques, and continuous practice that CERT provides prepares you for the unknown! You never know when you will need it- unfortunately things could happen with the blink of an eye. It also helps with mindset. On the occasion of an incident/emergency you would know what to do to help yourself, family, and neighbors more effectively and without panic.

How do you think CERT volunteers can help the City of Miami Beach during Emergencies?

The contributions during an emergency are on a 'hands on, grass-roots level'. Team members for each building would be able to identify cases specific for their building, and will know what to do, such as provide basic triage, and communicate with first responders on what's going on for their segment – it might be a small/individual segment but connected and can affect others.

What about during non-emergencies?

The information to communicate with each other is very important to be accurate and up to date and CERT volunteers can help make sure that the data is correct and current. They can assist identifying who are the people in their buildings, elderly, young, handicap etc. and work with their HOA to have awareness and consciousness and information in a restricted database.

Hopes/Vision for CERT in Miami Beach:

The City is doing well promoting itself as a city that cares for its residents. The hope is for the

Miami Beach CERT Program to continue to be a thriving part of the City government where the Leaders continue to support, fund, and promote it to further expand it through the communities.

Miami Beach is transient and growing fast and it is important to also have as much of diversified base of CERT trainees, for multiple languages, impaired individuals etc.

Amani is always on the lookout for additional classes and opportunities to volunteer. Next, she would like to become CPR certified. When asked on what CERT members should know about her, her reply was "I am always there for them, a helping hand & go to resource person for the community"

With the recent tornados in Broward and Palm Beach counties, having trained volunteers on the ground has become increasingly important.
